		7. What type of paint will be you be using? Depending on the VOC levels, you may need to contact HRS Disability Services to determine if there are any chemically sensitive individuals in the building that may be adversely affected. Use of low VOC latex paints is generally advisable.		

SELF HELP – PAINTING REQUEST

## The Department or unit requesting to do self-help painting must agree to the following conditions:

- 1. All individuals involved in the painting activity are properly trained (outlined above).
- 2. All costs of materials will be funded by the Department. If Facilities Services assistance is required in any way, all associated time, materials and equipment are billable to the Department.



- 3. In some locations, walls may contain asbestos related materials. If you answered "Yes" to questions 1, 2, 3 or 4 above, a Good Faith Survey of the surfaces in question will be necessary. The university has conducted testing in most facilities on campus and may have data that can be referenced without sampling. However, if sampling of a new surface is required, it is a billable expense, and cost will depend on the number of locations requiring evaluation.
- 4. Scaffolding use requires a scaffolding competent person. Elevating work platforms, e.g. scissor lifts, boom lifts, require additional training and certification. Working at heights above 10 feet if not performed from a ladder, scaffold or lift requires a fall protection competent person. When working from ladders, use a safety belt and lanyard whenever work requires the use of both hands or when working 25 feet or more above the ground or floor. If scaffolding is required, then the self-help painting may not be approved.
- 5. Adjacent surfaces, furniture, and other equipment must be protected. Spills or splatters should be cleaned immediately. Clean up of areas not properly protected or cleaned will be a billable expense to the department.
- 6. Paint materials will be properly cleaned and disposed. Brushes or rollers are not to be cleaned in restroom sinks. When using latex paint, it is permissible to clean brushes and rollers in a utility sink. Solvents used for cleaning paint or painting equipment must be collected as dangerous waste. Submit a <a href="chemical collection request">chemical collection request</a> to EH&S for any unused paint, solvents or solvent waste. Dry latex paint may be disposed as trash.
- 7. Approved paint colors are listed on the bottom of this form. If an alternate paint color is used, contact Facilities for preapproval or the Department may be responsible for restoring the room to an approved paint color when the space is returned to the University for reassignment. The department may opt to use the self-help process (with a new request form) or by submitting a work request to Facilities Services and providing departmental funding.
